- Current or recently retired teacher or early childhood educator
- Has lots of energy and is able to walk long distances and stand for extended
 periods
- Enjoys the outdoors, farm animals, and kids
- Can follow the tour program but also improvise and entertain when necessary
- Engages with students at an age-appropriate level
- Works well in a team atmosphere but can also work alone
- First aid certification

• Tours are two hours each plus prep and clean up time

Job Description:

- Duties include set-up and clean-up of school tour activities, coordination with teachers and bus drivers upon arrival to Nature's Bounty, managing large groups of elementary school children in a calm and appropriate manner
- Guides will share knowledge of apple, pumpkin and corn growing practices, pollinator activity, farming life, harvesting, play games and lead activities
- Tours are conducted rain or shine and require a significant amount of walking and can involve lifting pumpkins
- Guides must be available for a training session prior to the season start
